The 2010 population for Aberdeenshire is 245,780; an increase of 0.9 per cent from 243,510 in 2009. The population of Aberdeenshire accounts for 4.7 per cent of the total population of Scotland.

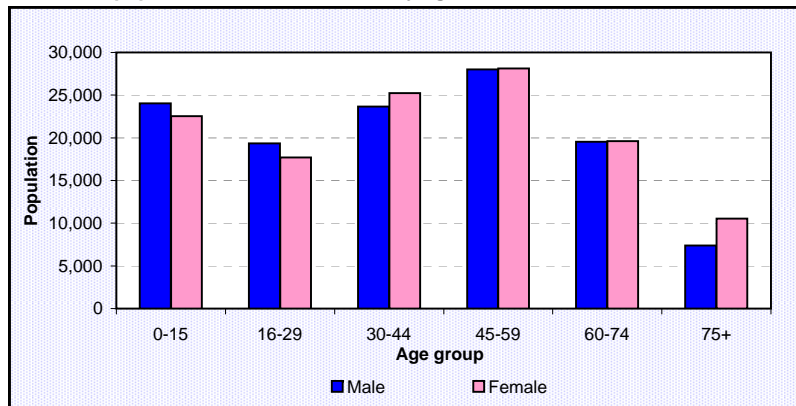
In Aberdeenshire, 15.1 per cent of the population are aged 16 to 29 years. This is smaller than Scotland where 18.7 per cent are aged 16 to 29 years. Persons aged 60 and over make up 23.2 per cent of Aberdeenshire. This is larger than Scotland where 23.1 per cent are aged 60 and over.

Since 1984, Aberdeenshire's total population has risen overall. Scotland's population has also risen over this period.

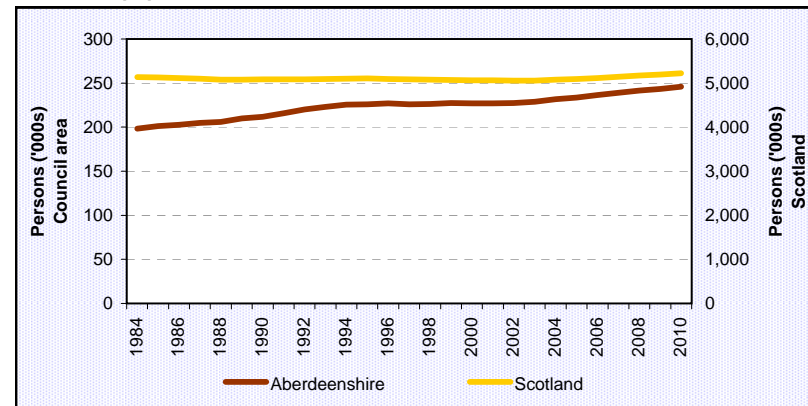

Births (calendar year)

Between 2009 and 2010 Aberdeenshire experienced a 6.1 per cent decrease in the number of births, dropping from 2,903 in 2009, to 2,727 in 2010. The number of births in Scotland fell by 0.4 per cent.

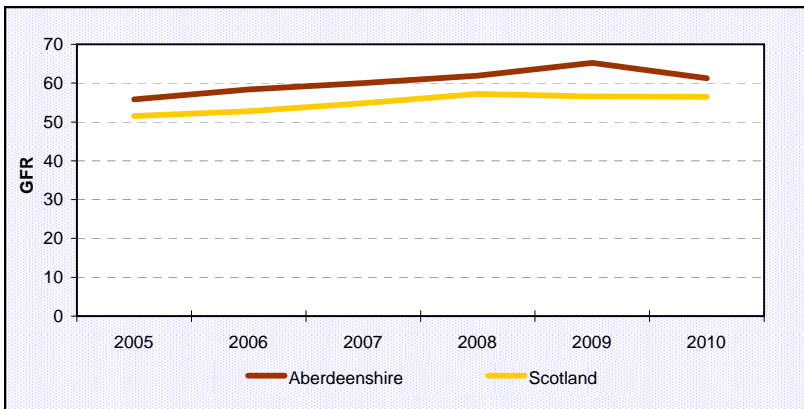
The most popular name given to boys born in Aberdeenshire in 2011 was Jack and the most popular name given to girls was both Emily and Sophie.

Fertility in Aberdeenshire decreased from 65.2 births per 1,000 women aged 15 to 44 in 2009, to 61.3 in 2010. For Scotland as a whole, the general fertility rate decreased from 56.6 births per 1,000 women aged 15 to 44 in 2009, to 56.5 in 2010.

Births in Aberdeenshire and Scotland, 2009 and 2010

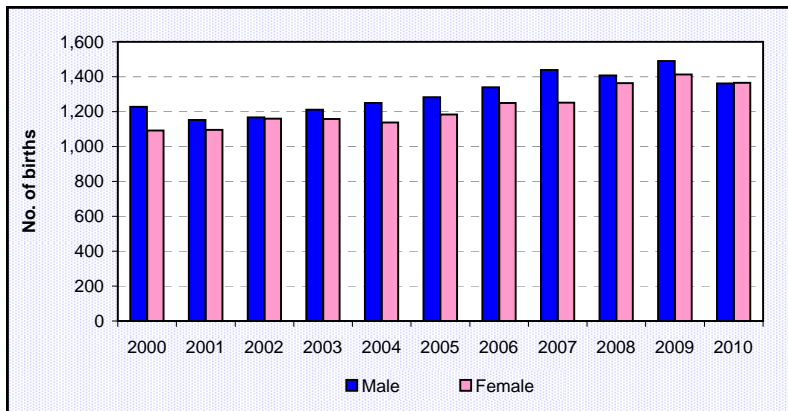

Live births by sex, Aberdeenshire, 2000-2010



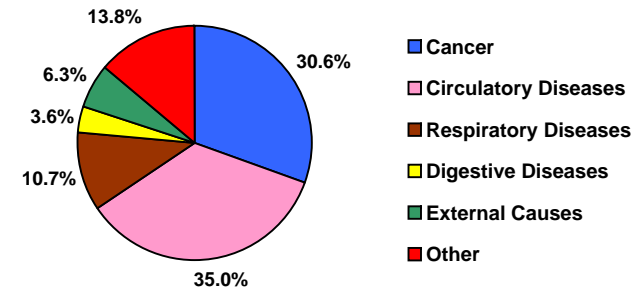
Deaths (calendar year)

The number of deaths in Aberdeenshire increased from 2,185 in 2009 to 2,252 in 2010. Over the period 2008 to 2010 the overall death rate was lower for males than for females. Compared to Scotland over the period 2008 to 2010, Aberdeenshire had a lower death rate. The main cause of death in Aberdeenshire was circulatory disease, followed by cancer.

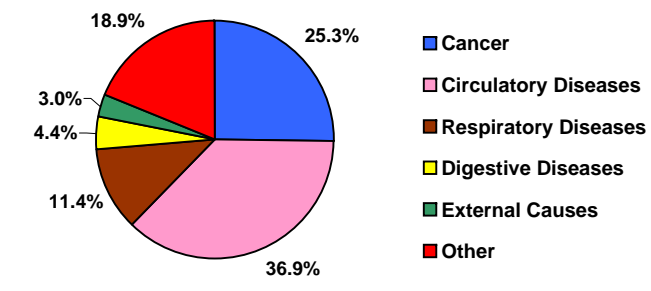

Migration

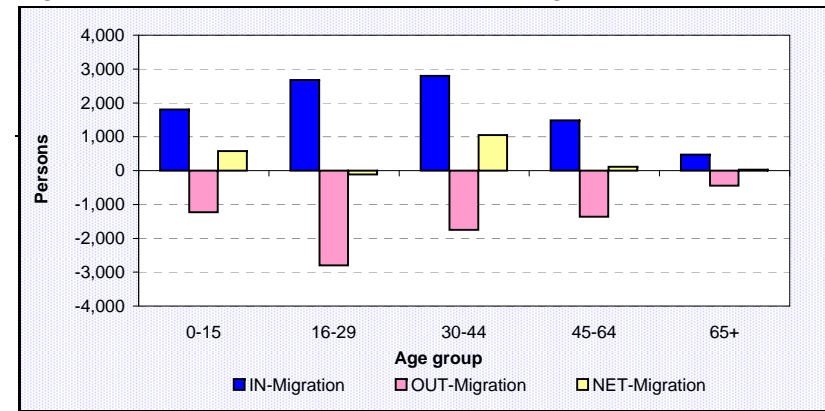
On average in 2008-10 there was a net inflow of 1,649 people into Aberdeenshire per year, meaning that more people entered Aberdeenshire (9,242 per year) than left (7,593 per year). The 30 to 44 year olds age group accounted for the largest group of in-migrants into Aberdeenshire. The largest group of out-migrants was the 16 to 29 year olds.

Life Expectancy

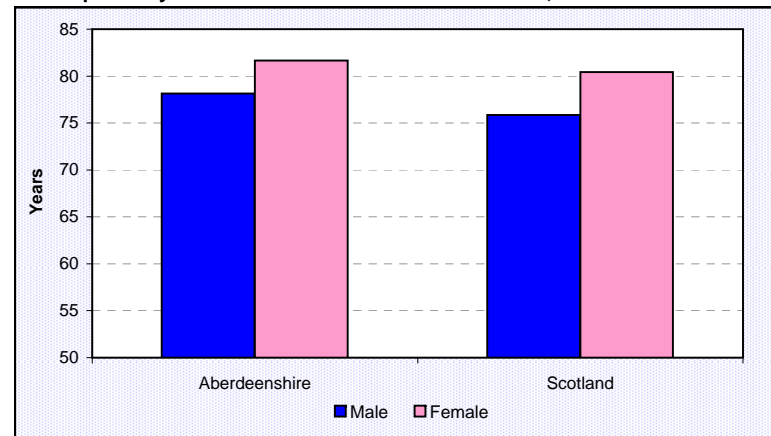
Female life expectancy at birth (81.7 years) is greater than male life expectancy (78.2 years), and both were greater than the Scottish average. Male life expectancy at birth in Aberdeenshire is improving more rapidly than female life expectancy.

In Aberdeenshire female life expectancy at age 65 (19.9 years) is greater than male life expectancy at age 65 (17.9 years).

Life expectancy at birth in Aberdeenshire and Scotland, 2008-2010



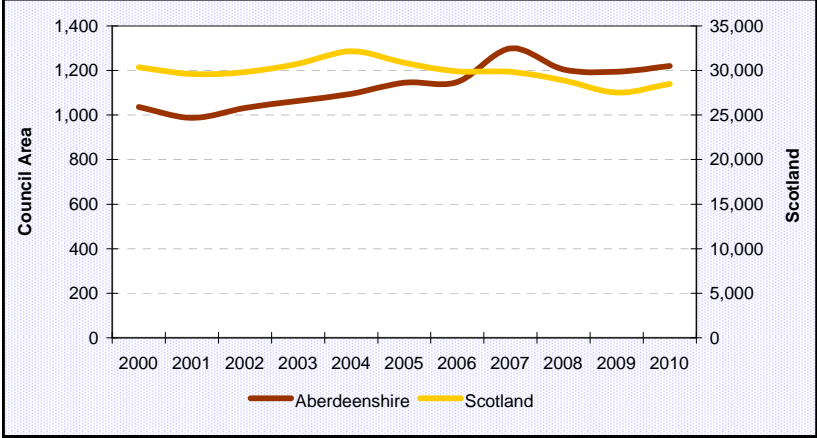
Marriages & Civil Partnerships

There were 1,221 marriages in Aberdeenshire in 2010; an increase of 2.2 per cent from 2009.
 In Aberdeenshire 53.6 per cent of people marrying in 2010 were aged 25-34. In Scotland as a whole 48.8 per cent of people marrying were in this age group.
 Since 2000 the number of marriages in Aberdeenshire has risen by 17.7 per cent.
 Scotland has seen an increase during the same period of time.

Population Projections

By 2033 the population of Aberdeenshire is projected to be 295,353, an increase of 22.3 per cent compared to the population in 2008. The population of Scotland is projected to increase by 7.3 per cent between 2008 and 2033.

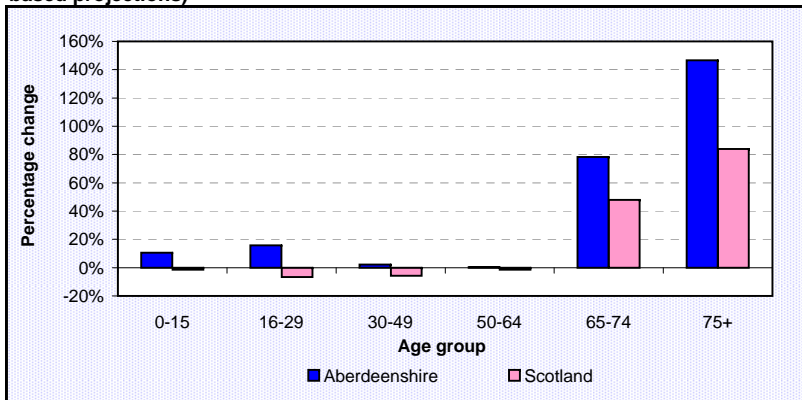
Over the 25 year period, the age group that is projected to increase the most in size in Aberdeenshire is the 75+ age group. This is the same as for Scotland as a whole.

The population aged under 16 in Aberdeenshire is projected to increase by 10.6 per cent over the 25 year period.

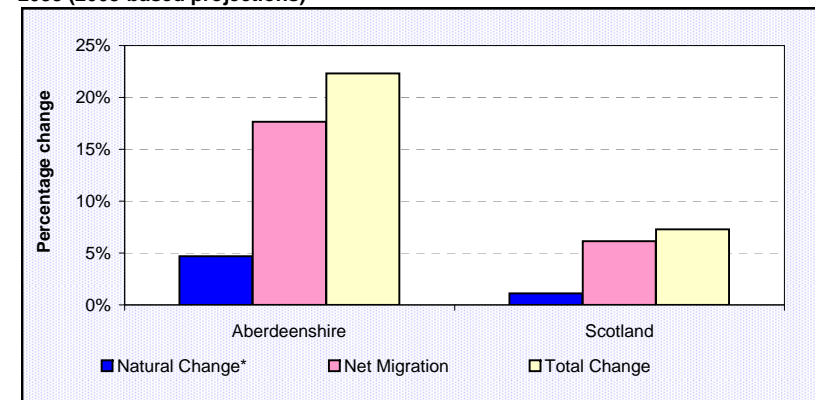

Households & Dwellings

The 2010 estimate of the number of households in Aberdeenshire is 103,770. This is a 1.1 per cent increase in the 2009 figure of 102,626, compared to a 0.5 per cent increase in Scotland as a whole. The proportion of these households receiving a single adult Council Tax discount is 29 per cent. For Scotland, this figure is 38 per cent.

With regards to the dwellings in Aberdeenshire, 95 per cent are occupied, 4 per cent are vacant and 1 per cent are second homes. The proportions of dwellings in Scotland which are vacant and second homes are 2.8 per cent and 1.4 per cent, respectively.

The 2010 estimate of the number of dwellings in Aberdeenshire is 109,552. This is an increase of 1.4 per cent from 2009 and compares to a 0.5 per cent increase across Scotland as a whole.

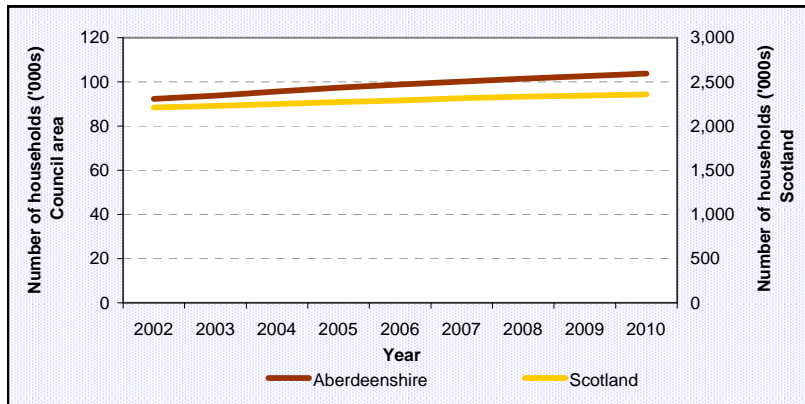

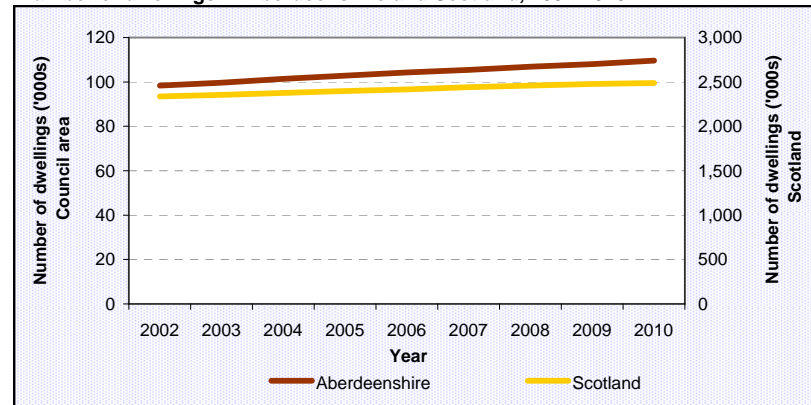

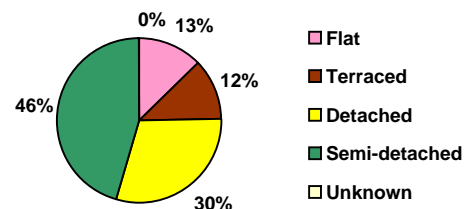
Number of households in Aberdeenshire and Scotland, 2002-2010



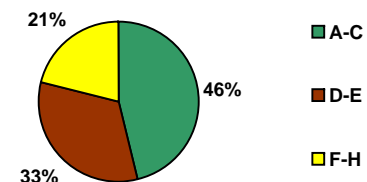
Number of dwellings in Aberdeenshire and Scotland, 2002-2010

Proportions of dwellings by Council Tax band in Aberdeenshire, 2010



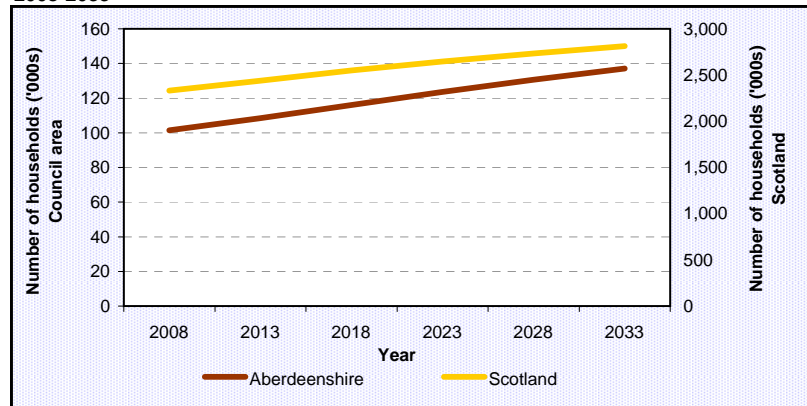
Household Projections

The total number of households in Aberdeenshire is projected to change from 101,520 in 2008 to 137,170 in 2033, which is an increase of 35 per cent. In Scotland as a whole, the projected number of households is set to increase by 21 per cent over the same 25 year period.

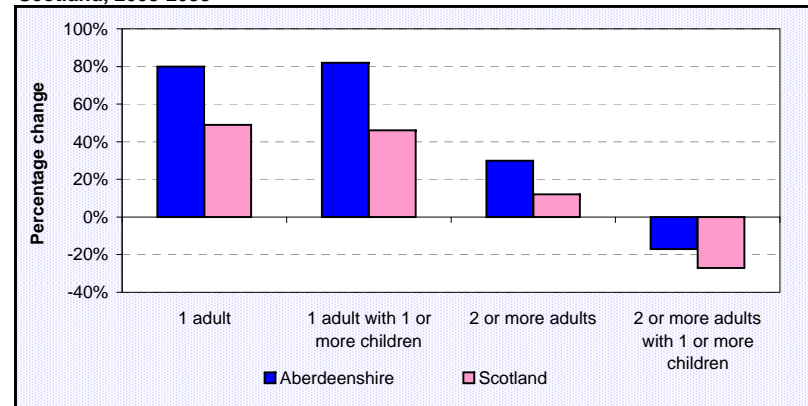
In Scotland, the number of lone adult households is projected to increase by 49 per cent over the 25 year period. In Aberdeenshire, the number of lone adult households is projected to increase by 80 per cent, and the number of larger households in Aberdeenshire is projected to fall, with the number of households of 2 or more adults with children decreasing by 17 per cent over the 25 year period. The average household size is projected to decrease from 2.36 in 2008 to 2.12 in 2033.

In Aberdeenshire, households headed by 60-74 year olds are projected to increase in number by 47 per cent, and those headed by the 75+ age group are projected to increase in number by 154 per cent between the years 2008 and 2033.
